Looking to the future

In spite of chilly winds – both seasonal and financial – Samling is working harder than ever to fulfil our aims as a charity and offer the best in musical education to young people of all ages.

We have three Masterclass weeks planned in 2012, with the first in February led by Australian soprano Yvonne Kenny, and Iain Burnside who we welcome back to Samling (full details inside). We are looking forward to our Patron Sir Thomas Allen leading a week in May with Roger Vignoles – bound to ignite the creative spark in the eight young Scholars they will guide, sharing insights and their artistry along the way with audiences at King's Hall, Newcastle University and The Sage Gateshead. And the final week, in November, will see the great German baritone Olaf Bär and David Syrus, Director of Music at the Royal Opera House Covent Garden, again come together for Samling in a combination which was so successful two years ago.

Auditions for all three Masterclass Weeks took place last summer over four days in London and Glasgow and twenty four young artists have been chosen from well over a hundred who were recommended to us. Struck once again by the musical excellence of those who won places, we are confident that the standard of student we are admitting to our courses is in no danger of falling.

In September Samling has accepted an invitation to make its debut at Kings Place in London as part of their Festival and will present three concerts involving ten Scholars, including pianist Joseph Middleton and introduced by Sir Thomas Allen. 2012 also sees the launch of 'Young Samling', a new Outreach project with young musicians in the North East. At the invitation of Newcastle University and The Sage Gateshead, Samling is offering a new project that will provide an opportunity for aspiring young singers and pianists here in the North East to work with our professional team. Our annual fundraising 'Party in the Garden' in Tynedale is planned for Sunday July 1st with non-stop music, home-cooked barbeque lunch and afternoon tea and an exhibition of original art for sale. And to round off a busy year we will once again present our annual Showcase at Wigmore Hall in London on Thursday 6th December.

The first Masterclass of 2012 in February sees the return of Australian soprano Yvonne Kenny to Samling.

Particularly associated with her interpretations of Mozart and Handel, she is equally accomplished in repertoire that ranges from great classical works to Viennese operetta and song.

It has been two years since Yvonne was with us and her disappointment last year when she was unable to perform at our Gala Concert in Carlisle was only matched by the disappointment of the audience. 'So when the opportunity arose to present the concert at the end of Masterclass Week in Carlisle I was delighted,' she said 'and am looking forward immensely to performing there for the first time.'

Joining her to coach eight young artists – six singers and two accompanists – will be Iain Burnside and

pianist Caroline Dowdle and vocal consultant Paul Farrington.



lain enjoys a unique reputation as pianist and broadcaster and we are delighted that he has accepted our invitation to join us once again.

As a regular broadcaster and an acclaimed programmer, Iain has forged, through his commitment to the song repertoire and his collaborations with leading international singers, a most varied and successful career. In particular he has devised a number songs by Beethoven, Korngold

of innovative recitals combining music and poetry, presented with huge success in Brussels and Barcelona with the collaboration of actors such as Fiona Shaw, Harriet Walter and Simon Russell Beale.

At the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, he is Research Associate, staging specially conceived programmes with student singers and pianists. He has given masterclasses throughout Europe, at New York's Juilliard School and the Banff Centre, Canada. lain's broadcasting career covers both radio and TV and he has been honoured with a Sony Radio Award.

His recording portfolio reflects his passion for British music and other recent acclaimed releases include


and Liszt on Signum, and Richard Rodney Bennett on NMC (Daneman/ Bickley/Williams).

'It is so important for young singers and pianists to receive different input from their weekly studies with their regular teachers and coaches and they are more than ready to take on other points of view,' lain said.

'The fact that Samling's net now extends so far means that they get the chance of meeting and working with colleagues, not only from other colleges here in the UK, but also from overseas. The experience is rich not only in language terms, for after all languages are key to classical singing, but they also absorb cultural influences and extend their professional friendships.'

Young Samling

Samling is internationally known for its work with emerging young professional singers and pianists. Our week-long courses offer them an exceptional environment to study, reflect and create, working alongside some of the greatest artists and coaches in the world today.

But now we would like to focus on the next generation here in the North East: the young singers and pianists who may be inspired to follow in their footsteps.

Young singers have to wait for their voices to mature before they can begin to pursue a career in classical singing. This new project will provide a taste of 'what it takes' to be a performer and inspire its participants towards their future goals, increase their confidence and address issues of technique, performance and stage-craft.

The programme will also be open to young pianists hoping to gain skills in accompaniment, something which is not often taught outside of the conservatoire environment yet is such an important skill for every aspiring pianist. Young Samling will involve the International Centre for Music Studies at Newcastle University and The Sage Gateshead's Weekend School singers, including pupils of Miranda Wright. Miranda is a Samling Scholar, having participated in Masterclass in 1999. She realised early on in the years that followed her calling lay in teaching rather than performance and is committed to training young voices, in particular here in the North East.

'I am delighted to be able to support Miranda's professional development through this project and it is fitting that we are now seeing, coming through the ranks, Scholars who are able to become leaders in their turn and in this way pass on their craft and insight,' said Director Karon Wright.

It is hoped that the project will become an annual focus for classical singing in the region and enable The Sage Gateshead and Newcastle University to forge a link, through Samling, in classical performance. Links between the University and The Sage Gateshead exist in folk performance and in contemporary composition, but not in classical performance.

'All these young musicians will not only get the opportunity to work with Samling's masters but also learn from working alongside the other young people involved,' said Karon Wright.
