arena, the Samling Foundation's groundbreaking public art initiative in the North East has got off to the best possible start. The Launch, early in February, brought together the key participants for the first time at BALTIC, The Centre for Contemporary Art in Gateshead. After months of hard work and preparation, worldrenowned artist Antony Gormley, who is leading the

project, said that 'we couldn't have had a better first day'.

After a rigorous shortlisting and interview process five emerging professional artists have been selected to participate. They are Runa Islam, Wolfgang Weileder, Carl von Weiler, Louise K. Wilson and Tom Woolford.

Each artist will receive a major public art commission to work within an 'arena' of their choice for a three month period and produce a piece of public art which can take any form.

These 'arenas' will be carefully chosen by the artists and might include transport networks, business, industry or the broadcasting media.

Sixty of Tyne and Wear's most gifted 'A' Level Art students have also been selected to work alongside them. After a week of interviews, with over 120 students being given the opportunity to impress, the Foundation feels confident that it has a very special group of young people on board. Each student will have the opportunity of experiencing at first hand how an artist researches and creates an artwork, and will work alongside them throughout – an experience few receive, even at University.

Together, Antony Gormley, the artists and students will be given time to talk, listen and explore the parameters of public art and its relationship to different environments and the wider communities. As part of the Launch the five groups visited potential sites across the region before returning to BALTIC to focus on the work ahead.

The £224,000 arena project is being part-funded by a £116,790 education award from NESTA (the National Endowment for Science, Technology and the Arts). The Chairman, Lord Puttnam, said 'NÉSTA is delighted to be supporting this exciting public art and education initiative. We were particularly impressed by Samling's ethos and commitment to provide exactly the right environment in which gifted and talented students could flourish. One of NESTA's key aims is to nurture and support creativity in young people and I feel certain that arena will unearth some truly imaginative talent. It's tremendous to attract a world-renowned artist such as Antony Gormley to mentor this new generation of artists.' Additional funding will come from the five LEAs involved (Newcastle, North Tyneside, South Tyneside, Gateshead and Sunderland), Northern Rock Foundation, Northern Arts and the Samling Foundation, with in-kind costs and organisational support from BALTIČ, The Centre for Contemporary Art, a key partner in the project.

period, then see the site become an online exhibition of the finished works when the project draws to a close in June 2003.



2003 highlights

Seven years on and our music programme for 2003 is shaping up to be our best year yet!

We are expanding the masterclass programme to include two week-long opportunities for intensive study and performance. In March and November, led by our Patron Sir Thomas Allen and Della Jones respectively, twelve outstanding young singers will be given the time to reflect, work and above all be inspired. They have been chosen after three days of auditions in London and Glasgow, when over 60 young singers were invited to come and perform for our panel. The standard was exceptional. We heard some outstanding singing and musicianship, which

made the final selection hard. That said, we are confident that we have found some truly gifted young people.

For the first time the Foundation has invited two great artists from the classical acting tradition to join the masterclass team. Barbara Leigh Hunt and Richard Pascoe will be coming to work alongside Della Jones and Paul Farrington in November. This is in keeping with the Foundation's desire to bring artists from different disciplines together to explore what can be learned from each other. As always, there will be opportunities to see the results of this hard work in masterclass and in performance. Full details are printed in Diary Dates on this page.

Expanding our masterclass opportunities still further, the Foundation is developing a new programme of choral workshops, led by Paul Farrington, one of only two vocal consultants in the UK, and Simon Over. Working on agreed repertoire taken from the Music Theatre and the Classical traditions, it will offer coaching and technical support for up to 200 music students and their teachers in Cumbria during both Masterclass Weeks, culminating in a performance of the music studied.

We were extremely disappointed that through illness we had to cancel last year's concert with Katarina Karnéus and Rebecca Evans. We were determined however to find another date to bring these two international stars together to perform for the first time. Given their schedules for the next four years it looked grim at first but we've done it! They will perform in our North East debut concert at Newcastle's Assembly Rooms on July 17th. Another date for your diary!

The success of our first concert in London at St John's in Smith Square last September has led to calls for another. We are busy at the moment making the final arrangements and the date and venue will be announced later.
