Samling welcomes acclaimed mezzo-soprano Angelika Kirchschlager

April sees the return to Samling of one of world's great classical artists, mezzo-soprano Angelika Kirchschlager, to lead our second Masterclass Week this year.


In a double coup for Samling she will be joined by her fellow Austrian, the celebrated pianist Helmut Deutsch. With Christopher Glynn and Patricia MacMahon, they will guide eight exceptional young singers and pianists through a week's intensive study of opera and song.

The public Masterclass on Wednesday 17 April in Hall Two at The Sage Gateshead will offer a 'fly on the wall' insight into the work that goes on in private all week. This increasingly popular event will appeal to anyone who enjoys seeing how young artists can take on board new ideas and advice to turn a good performance into an outstanding one.

Angelika and Helmut have performed and recorded together many times, including a CD of lieder by Schumann. The German Romantic composer also inspires a selection of solo and ensemble performances in the Samling Concert, showcasing the newest members of Samling's renowned group of Scholars. The programme will also contain opera arias and ensembles by Mozart, Bizet and Gounod.



Helmut Deutsch joins Samling's Leadership Team

Samling is delighted to welcome for the first time the distinguished Austrian pianist Helmut Deutsch. He has accompanied a host of famous musicians from the outset of his career with Irmgard Seefried to present day stars such as the tenor Jonas Kaufmann and of course his fellow Samling Masterclass leader Angelika Kirchschlager.

For twelve years, Helmut was the regular partner of the celebrated baritone Hermann Prey. He has made very many prize winning recordings and is a frequent guest at international music centres and festivals throughout the world.

Now he combines performance with teaching, holding professorships at conservatoires in Munich, Nuremberg and Frankfurt and regularly gives masterclasses in Europe and Japan.

Samling Academy Opera

In Benjamin Britten's centenary year, Samling will present a new production this summer of his comic masterpiece of English village life, Albert Herring.

The opera tells the tale of Albert, a shy lad in a grocer's shop, who is forced into the limelight when the village committee decides to crown him 'May King'. This title, usually given to a 'May Queen' is bestowed as no young woman of good character in the village could meet the exacting standards of Lady Billows, so poor Albert is chosen. The virtuous Albert's crowning does not go according to plan however in this timeless coming of age story based on a novella by the French writer Guy de Maupassant.

Three Samling Scholars are leading this production, with Miranda Wright as director, pianist James Baillieu as director of music and baritone Johnny Herford will join members of the Academy to perform the role of Sid.

Auditions took place in February and tenor Alex Banfield has been cast in the title role of Albert. Alex, from Newcastle, has won a place at the Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester starting in September and sees this opportunity as great preparation.

'I am very excited about the whole thing. I get to work with James Baillieu, an amazing musician, with Johnny Herford a professional singer and Samling Scholar, we have direction and coaching from Miranda Wright. All of that and I get to work and perform with friends I made at Samling – Amazing!' said Alex.

'By bringing back established Samling Scholars to work alongside Academy students who are beginning to 'find their feet', in a production from and for the North East, Samling completes a virtuous circle, embodying all that we were hoping for in founding our Academy,' said director Karon Wright.

'Along the way I am sure that they will not only learn a lot from the experience but have fun as they discover the humour and humanity in their characters.'

Three fully staged and costumed public performances of Albert Herring are planned – one at Saltburn Community Theatre, where most of the rehearsals will take place, and two in Hall Two at The Sage Gateshead on Wednesday 14, Friday 16 and Saturday 17 August respectively.
