It's the original 'dream team' again leading our last Masterclass of the year in October. We welcome back Patricia MacMahon who will be joining Sir Thomas Allen supported by vocal consultant Paul Farrington for a week of outstanding music making in private and in public at The Sage Gateshead.

Supported by pianists Caroline Dowdle and Simon Over they will be working with the cream of young classical singers, whom Samling have auditioned over the past year in London and Glasgow.

The standard just gets better and better and this group of young singers is no exception. Sopranos Helen-Jane Howells and Nadine Livingston, mezzo Charlie Tetley, tenor Peter Gijsbertsen, baritone Lukas Kargl and bass-baritone Samuel Evans have been chosen because they are exceptional.

Over the week they are with us they will work incredibly hard – eating, living and breathing music alongside the course tutors. There is no escape but they all seem to thrive on it, not least at the hands of Mr Farrington, who never fails to find some gizmo to get across his point. So with pilates balls at the ready, tickets for the public Masterclass on Thursday 9th October in Hall Two at The Sage Gateshead are on sale now.

The concert on Sunday 12th October is the culmination of the week's efforts and so many Samling supporters comment on how much they enjoy coming back to Hall Two to witness the progress the young singers have made in the intervening days.



Samling Outreach

Supported by The Gillian Dickinson Trust, Samling has been busy making plans for a new education project, which kicks off in County Durham in November.

The project, over two years, will involve pupils from Belmont School Community and Arts College, its feeder primary schools - Ludworth, Sherburn Village, Pittington and St Hild's - and Gilesgate Sixth Form Centre and it will be the first time Samling has worked in the city and surrounding villages.

Samling Scholars including Louise Collett, Mark Chaundy and James Harrison have been chosen to take part over four days alongside the Berkeley Ensemble, all members of Southbank Sinfonia's growing alumni. Together, under the music direction of Simon Over, they will take part in presentations, workshops and performances and work with the students aged 5 – 18 towards a professional concert at the end of the week's activities for parents and the wider community.

Samling's project manager Katrina Conaty will be going into schools from the start of the Autumn term to teach the songs and ensembles to the children and co-ordinate the choral elements. "After three successful years in Northumberland, we are looking forward to adapting and developing this project for Durham students. It will be the first time we will have worked with schools in this area – exciting times!" said Katrina.

Next year we are planning to work with the same schools and bring Southbank Sinfonia to the region once again, with the final concert at Durham's Gala Theatre on Friday 2nd October 2009.

Samling scholar wins again

For the second year running a Samling Scholar has won Britain's most prestigious singing competition.

The Kathleen Ferrier Memorial Scholarship Fund holds an Annual Competition before a public audience at the Wigmore Hall in London every April. Young professional singers compete for glittering cash prizes plus the chance to gain instant international recognition. This year it was tenor Ben Johnson who scooped first prize.

"It's easy in hindsight to know when it is the right time to enter a competition like the Ferrier. Having had my application accepted, my mind was full of doubts about whether I was ready. ('What should I sing?' being one of them.) Fortunately for me my time at Samling came a good two months before the competition. Having a chance to work on potential repertoire with Della and Paul was a real luxury. Songs and arias were as much ruled out as put in, as the work on the course makes clear to you at what stage a piece is at in your voice.

I actually chose my Schubert song for the competition, 'Vor meine Wiege', because it popped up on my ipod as I walked one sunny February afternoon around the grounds at Farlam.

I came away from the week with my programme decided. I feel very fortunate to have won and many exciting things are coming up for me in the months ahead", he said.

Samling is always keen to follow the progress and careers of singers who have taken part in its Masterclass programme and the same can be said about students from its education and outreach projects.

So when Chris Mole, a student who took part in the *Don Giovanni* Education Project last year, was the overall winner in a talent competition at Newcastle City Hall, we thought a catch-up was in order!

Singing 'Time to Say Goodbye', a duet made famous by Sarah Brightman and Andrea Bocelli, 15 year-old Chris and school friend Molly were one of 4,000 entrants into the 'TalentStar' competition. With heats in various locations, a semi-final and then a final, Chris and Molly were "gobsmacked" to be announced the overall winners.

"The song we had picked was an unusual one for TalentStar, with most entrants choosing pop songs. When the announcement was made that we had won, we were so shocked! It was crazy!" said Chris.

It seems that the *Don Giovanni* project has influenced Chris' singing to the extent that operatic arias now feature regularly in his performances in and out of school.

"It is my favourite sort of singing. Before the project I hadn't been exposed to the world of opera - I am so glad the project came along. It's what I want to do now. I'm aiming to go to the Royal Scottish Academy when I have finished school".

With a youth opera at The Sage Gateshead coming up and an album to record as part of the prize for winning TalentStar, it appears Chris is already laying firm roots for a career in singing.

Could this young tenor be a future Samling Scholar? Watch this space!

ROH Young Artist

Simona Mihai will be joining another Samling Scholar, Pumeza Matshikiza, on the Royal Opera House Covent Garden's Jette Parker Young Artists' Programme this Autumn.

The Romanian soprano, who performed in last year's Wigmore Showcase, will take her place on this prestigious two-year programme in September joining other Scholars who have previously made their mark there, including Sally Matthews, Jared Holt and Nikola Matisic.
