We start our 21st year with a special Gala Concert with Royal Northern Sinfonia and a bevy of Samling Artists from across the years. Joining our Patron Sir Thomas Allen for 'A Night at the Viennese Opera' on Friday 17 February is soprano Rowan Pierce, mezzo-soprano Anna Stéphany, tenor Luis Gomes and baritone Johannes Kammler.

Conducted by Nicholas Chalmers, artistic director of Nevill Holt Opera, Samling Academy Singers will also be taking to the Sage One stage, alongside two previous participants of the programme – Charlotte La Thrope and Jordan Carlton – both now studying singing full-time at the Royal College of Music in London.

The programme will celebrate opera from the Austrian capital with the sublime music of Mozart's Le nozze di Figaro and Così fan tutte, Strauss's Die Fledermaus and the evergreen melodies of operetta and Lehár's Die lustige Witwe. (Full programme details on our website www.samling.org.uk)

In March we welcome to Samling for the very first time baritone Roderick Williams. He will join Australian soprano Yvonne Kenny and pianist Christopher Glynn to lead eight new Samling Artists following auditions for our Artist Programme last year. A public masterclass on Saturday 11 March followed by a short concert on the same afternoon will showcase the work carried out in private during the week.

Six Samling Artists are soloists – again with Royal Northern Sinfonia – in two performances of Handel's oratorio, Israel in Egypt, conducted by Nicholas McGegan. Long hailed as 'one of the finest baroque conductors of his generation' (The Independent) and 'an expert in 18th-century style' (The New Yorker), Nicholas is recognised for his probing and revelatory explorations of music of all periods. The first performance with Royal Northern Sinfonia Chorus – at Durham Cathedral on Tuesday 11 April – is followed by a second chance to hear Handel's vivid depictions of this epic biblical narrative at Sage Gateshead on Thursday 13 April.

We will be announcing dates for our Academy's summer production very soon, so keep a look out for details on our website and on social media.

In October we will kick-start the next academic year for our Academy with six days of intensive training over two weekends. Vocal masterclasses and tuition, workshops in acting and movement and language coaching will culminate in Sage Two on Sunday 29 October when twenty-five Academy Singers will share what they have been working on in concert.

Thursday 9 November sees us back at Wigmore Hall for our annual Showcase before our final Artist Programme week of the year. Following auditions in May in London and Glasgow, we will invite eight new and outstanding emerging artists to spend a week with us and then share what they have learned in a public masterclass and concert at Sage Gateshead on Saturday 9 December.

'We are looking forward to a year of exceptional music making, discovery and opportunity,' said Samling's director Karon Wright. 'Having reached this 21st milestone I do believe "the best is yet to be".' she said.

In the second of a series of guest columns by Samling Artists, mezzo-soprano Anna Stéphany discusses her memories of her time with Samling and the effect the experience has had since she attended our Artist Programme in 2005.

There is really nothing else like Samling out there. Singing is a very personal thing and requires a deep understanding of the self and an understanding of how to communicate emotions with others. All this takes a lot of exploration and trial and error: the only atmosphere in which to do that is a safe, fun and supportive one and Samling provides exactly that.

I was lucky enough to benefit from the teaching of Della Jones, Paul Farrington,

Caroline Dowdle and Simon Over and I have fond memories of sitting round the fire together after the day's work was done sharing recitations of Shakespeare and poetry. There were also further moments of inspiration and learning as the actors Richard Pasco and Barbara Leigh Hunt were with us that week and they shared with us their poignant interpretations of the texts.

I would recommend every student out there given the opportunity of an audition for Samling to seize it and to benefit from being part of this lovely family!

I am hugely excited to be performing at the Sage again for the 'Coming of Age' Gala, especially with Sir Thomas Allen, having worked with him at the Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow. Being a North East girl it is always a pleasure to perform near home and Sage One is stunning.

I have just finished performing the role of Romeo in Bellini's *I Capuleti e i Montecchi* at Zurich Opera House, and I am currently singing the role of Octavian in Strauss' *Der Rosenkavalier* at the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden; both trouser roles which is something I love doing!

Anna appears with three other Samling Artists, Sir Thomas Allen, Royal Northern Sinfonia and Samling Academy Singers in A Night at the Viennese Opera, our 'Coming of Age' Gala on Friday 17 February at Sage Gateshead. All twenty-five of our Academy Singers responded in full to our evaluation of six days of intensive workshops and performance in October.

'We are delighted with the results,' said Mary Emmett, who conducted the research. 'Every year we seek detailed feedback on Academy Singers' experience and five years into the programme they gave, once again, a ringing endorsement of the value of their learning experience with us,' she said.

stagecraft over the first three days at Durham University and we were delighted that Samling Artist Lisa Milne, who took part in the very first Artist Programme week twenty years ago, joined us in Newcastle University for the second weekend when our Patron Sir Thomas Allen also joined us for an afternoon and gave a fascinating talk about his life,' Mary said.

Academy Singers particularly singled out in their evaluation how much they had benefitted from the work of movement coach and choreographer Mandy Demetriou,

and working on their Italian with language coach Rosalba Lo Duca, in preparation for the concert showcasing their work in the Northern Rock Foundation Hall at Sage Gateshead on 23 October.

'I've loved meeting like I fit in,' said Academy Singer Zoë Jackson. 'I spoke to a number of other singers who, at school, felt excluded due to their passions, so being in the environment where everyone has a similar dream really pushed me and consolidated the idea of singing being what I really want to do,' she said.

Welcoming Roderick Williams to Samling

Roderick Williams, who won the Singer of the Year Award in the 2016 Royal Philharmonic Society Awards, came to professional singing relatively late. On leaving Oxford University, where he had a choral scholarship, he taught music for a few years in London before deciding to study full-time at the age of 28 at the Guildhall School of Music.

Professional roles from Purcell to Puccini, from Mozart to Maxwell Davies have brought Roderick ever-greater international success and he is now one of the UK's most celebrated and versatile singers. His numerous recordings include Vaughan Williams, Berkeley and Britten operas for Chandos and an extensive repertoire of English song with pianist lain Burnside for Naxos.

'We are very excited that Roderick has accepted our invitation to join us in March to

lead our Samling Artist Programme,' said director Karon Wright. 'I feel very sure that our eight new Samling Artists are going to have a terrific week,' she said. 'As a composer with works premiered at the Wigmore and Barbican Halls, the Purcell Room and live on national radio, I think he will bring an extra dimension to the week, as well as his bounding enthusiasm and passion for singing,' she said.

'I'm looking forward to this intensive course that will allow us to examine repertoire in real depth, giving us a proper chance to examine all manner of performance technique, a subject close to my heart. The course attracts students of remarkable talent with highly individual skills to offer and I have no doubt I too will share and learn a great deal from working with them. 
