The exquisite Arts and Crafts Music Room at Marchmont House is the setting for the first of a series of concerts we are presenting at this historic venue in the Scottish Borders.

Join us this summer

Samling Artists soprano Haegee Lee and tenor Nicky Spence will be joined by pianist Malcolm Martineau on Friday 20 May for an evening of song in English.

The programme will draw on the house's rich musical associations from past and present to include music by composers who have visited the house – Ralph Vaughan Williams, Charles Villiers Stanford and most recently, Jonathan Dove. In July last year Jonathan joined us at Marchmont as part of our Artist Programme residency when he shared with us the duet cycle *Man, Woman, Child* that we commissioned to mark our 25th anniversary. This will surely be one of the highlights of this early evening concert.

Marking the 150th anniversary of Vaughan Williams, who was a regular visitor to Marchmont, Nicky will be singing *On Wenlock Edge* having just released his recording of the cycle in April 2022 to resounding critical acclaim. Described as one of the 'finest ever' recordings for 'its thrilling assurance, strength of imagination and rapt instinct' (Gramophone Magazine) this is a special opportunity to hear his 'gift for combining pure tone with direct, daring expression' (The Guardian).

Haegee Lee and Malcolm Martineau are making welcome returns to Marchmont. Malcolm led our Samling Artist Programme there in November 2021, and Haegee was one of the artists on the same course. Along with Amy Beach's settings of Robert Browning, Haegee will sing 'A Soft Day' by Charles Villiers Stanford, who was a close friend of Marchmont's former owner Robert Finnie McEwan and was involved in the design of the house's organ. There will also be songs by Purcell, Elgar, Parry, Bridge and Quilter.

This will be the first event at Marchmont that we have been able to offer free from the restrictions imposed by the pandemic and we are thrilled that we can finally throw open the doors to our Friends and supporters and share this wonderful venue with them,' said Artistic and Executive director Karon Wright.

samling shorts Haegee Lee

Samling Artist soprano Haegee Lee was born in South Korea and trained at Seoul National University and the Conservatoire National de Région Pierre Barbizet, Marseille. She now studies with Isabelle Vernet. She was a Jette Parker Young Artist at the Royal Opera House and returns there this season to sing Papagena in *Die Zauberflöte.* Next season she makes her debut at English National Opera as Queen Tye *Akhnaten* and sings Musetta *La bohème* for Welsh National Opera.

My earliest musical memory is...

Playing a very easy piano version of Twinkle, twinkle little star' next to my Mum when I was three years old, and my first stage experience was when I was seven, singing a Christmas cantata in the Korean church.

The last piece of music I listened to was... My favourite music is jazz. Nowadays I'm falling in love with Enzo Orefice Trio. **My three essential travel items are...** *Noise-cancelling headphones, coffee and thriller books.*

The place in South Korea that everyone should visit is... Gyeongbokgung. This is a very lovely old palace in downtown Seoul. It was built over 600 years ago, but most halls and pavilions were destroyed during the Japanese colonial rule in the 19th century because the old palaces were symbolic places representing Korea as an independent nation. This lovely palace was finally restored to its original state in the 1990s. This place is really historical and if you love K- Drama on Netflix, it's the setting for 'Kingdom'.

When I have a day off, I like to ...

Go to galleries and museums in London. My favourite places are the Courtauld Gallery, Tate Modern and White Cube. When I moved to London in 2017 my friend told me that most of the galleries and museums are free of charge so I am trying to visit them all! And I love to try to memorize opera scores while I walk in the gallery.

My dream role would be ...

Lucia from 'Lucia di Lammermoor'. But my first dream when I was 13 was to sing Carmen

because I saw the New York Metropolitan Opera 'Carmen' with my Mum, and that was why I started to study opera. But years later, my professor explained that I'm a very high soprano, so I couldn't sing Carmen and that first dream role was gone with my crying. But my next dream was Gilda, because my professor bought me a score of 'Rigoletto' when I started high school. I studied this role a lot and finally performed it in 2019 at Welsh National Opera with Alexander Joel just after I graduated from JPYAP. It was such a fabulous experience to sing a role I had dreamed of so much.

If I weren't a singer, I would be ...

An archaeologist. I love history, culture and adventure.

The best memory of my Samling Artist Programme week was ...

Every single moment with the leaders Joan Rodgers, Malcolm Martineau and James Garnon. They taught me some important skills but also they taught me the reality of music and how I can make my songs more alive and clear and sound more beautiful. So I was thinking lots of things about music and what I am singing about.



Timing is everything in opera and Dominic Sedgwick put this to the test when he joined us recently for our Samling Futures school visits. Could he finish his last aria as Marullo in *Rigoletto* at the Royal Opera House, get out of his costume and cycle across London in time for the last train to Newcastle?

Happily, Dominic rose to the challenge and made it north to join fellow Samling Artists mezzo-soprano Heather Lowe and pianist Lana Bode and five Academy Singers for three days of workshops.

Our team visited state secondary schools in Gateshead, Durham and Berwickshire, giving a lively introduction to classical singing through masterclasses with our Academy Singers and students from each school. Heather and Dominic used group activities to give students a 'tool kit' for singing and at the end of each session they treated the

audience to a performance of Mozart's duet 'La ci darem la mano' from *Don Giovanni*.
