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When Music Speaks

Our Samling Academy Singers invite you to eavesdrop on intimate conversations between families, friends and lovers in their summer concerts this July.

'Conversation Pieces' is a semi-staged production with song, opera and poetry, extending the performance skills that our Academy Singers have been developing over the year by using movement, props and lighting. The production will also include some of the work from our recent threeday 'Scenes from Opera' workshop, when the Academy Singers worked on selected scenes by Britten, Mozart and Tchaikovsky led by actor James Garnon and theatre director Susannah Waters. 'Conversation Pieces' will be directed by Samling Artist Miranda Wright and performances take place at Saltburn Arts and Sage Gateshead following an extended period of rehearsal and coaching. Samling Artist pianist Leo Nicholson joins the team as music director and will accompany the concerts.

Every summer, we say farewell to Academy Singers who are moving on to the next stage of their musical journey and once again this year we're delighted to see singers going on to undergraduate and postgraduate studies on scholarships at the country's top conservatoires.

We also look forward to welcoming our new Samling Academy cohort in October,

following auditions held at the end of March. Thirty young singers from schools and universities across the North East have been offered places, including students from the schools we visited for our Samling Futures workshops in January (see p2).

As we go to press, we are preparing for auditions in London and Glasgow for the Samling Artist Programme. Following a highly competitive three-stage process of recommendation, video application and live auditions, twelve singers and four pianists will be offered coveted places for two residential weeks to be held at Marchmont House in November 2023 and March 2024. with leaders including soprano Yvonne Kenny AM, pianists Simon Lepper and Samling Artist James Baillieu.

Samling and Song

The response to the first round of applications for our new Samling and Song residencies for singer and pianist duos has been fantastic. We asked for proposals that present art-song in new ways, to new audiences across the UK and which explore repertoire by under-represented groups.

The first two duos chosen to benefit are mezzo-soprano Shakira Tsindos and pianist Lana Bode and baritone Kieran Rayner and pianist Gamal Khamis. Over the next few months they will work with their project

mentors before spending a week at Marchmont to refine and rehearse their programmes. The variety and imagination of the applications we received made it clear that art-song has a lively future and we are looking forward to following the two selected projects through to fruition.



Samling at Sage

Six Samling Artists joined Royal Northern Sinfonia and conductor Nicholas McGegan at Sage One in February for a concert of baroque choral music alongside the UK premiere of Is a rose, a song cycle by American composer Caroline Shaw.

Mezzo-soprano Katherine Aitken (pictured above) gave an electrifying performance of Is a rose to an audience that included Newcastle based poet, Jacob Polley, whose poem 'The Edge' opens Shaw's work.

Katherine was joined by Samling Artists sopranos Harriet Burns and Lauren Lodge-Campbell, tenors Michael Bell and Harry Grigg and baritone Daniel Barrett for a setting of Dixit Dominus by Antonio Vivaldi and Johann Sebastian Bach's Magnificat. All six artists were making their Sage One debut and appreciated the warm welcome they received from the large audience.

Spotlight on Cardiff

Samling Artist singers have appeared in the finals of every BBC Cardiff Singer of the World competition since 2005 and this year is no exception. Mezzo-soprano Beth Taylor and bass William Thomas told us about their preparations for this year's finals.

Beth began by saying 'I'm really enjoying preparing my repertoire for Cardiff, which I'm treating more like a performance and less like a competition. I'm hoping the audience will enjoy what I offer and can only hope I present my truest and best self. It is tricky to balance preparing the competition alongside other exciting projects coming up over the summer but, whilst in the practice room, it's a great opportunity to continue delving into details and always weaving that perfect tapestry between text and music - our greatest privilege as singers! The Samling Artist Programme was a key moment in realising this and I'm very lucky to have been part of that journey of discovery, which I continue to travel."

William added 'As I prepare for Cardiff, I'm definitely still making use of what I learnt during the Samling Artist Programme. It was amazing that I got to work with Sir Mark Elder, Sir Thomas Allen and actor Alex Jennings in the same week. They really helped me not just as a singer but also as an actor, to stand still, not give too much with my face and gestures and to focus on using my eyes to communicate. That's particularly useful when you're performing arias in a concert situation such as Cardiff and it's just you and the music with nothing else to help you."

'It really means a lot to feel the firm voice of support from Samling Institute and to be reminded of what you do for emerging artists and it is warmly received in an otherwise turbulent time in our industry,' said Beth.

Beth and William follow 21 previous Samling Artist singers into the finals, among them Catriona Morison who won both the main prize and the song prize in 2017 and audienceprize winners Louise Alder and Claire Barnett-Jones. Watch out too for Samling Artist pianists in the Song Prize finals. We're looking forward to following Beth and William's progress and wish them all every success.

Samling Futures

There's something magical about seeing a hall full of buzzing, excited teenagers being brought to complete silence by a single voice.

Students at St Anthony's Girls' Catholic Academy in Sunderland were treated to a concert of opera arias by Samling Artists mezzosoprano Katherine Aitken, bass-baritone Neil Balfour and pianist Ella O'Neill as part of this year's Samling Futures visits. The project was bigger than ever, reaching over 500 students and teachers in seven state secondary schools in Berwickshire, Hexham, Newcastle, South Shields, Sunderland and Durham.

Katherine, Neil and Ella were joined by a team of six Samling Academy Singers who took part in masterclasses, demonstrating the skills that go into classical singing and giving a taster of what happens at Samling Academy. The Samling Artists also worked with singers from the host schools. We're delighted that some of those singers have now successfully auditioned for next year's Samling Academy and we look forward to welcoming them in October.
