Our Samling Artists have been inspiring hundreds of young people in schools across the North East with our Samling Futures workshops and the launch of our first Samling Singing School.

Soprano Anush Hovhannisyan, mezzosoprano Katherine Aitken, tenor Nick Pritchard, pianist Ella O'Neill and a team of eight Academy Singers worked with over five hundred students in state schools in Peterlee, Durham, Darlington, Stockton-on-Tees, Newcastle, Morpeth, North Shields and Whitley Bay. Together they coached both soloists and choirs, giving them tips for their own singing through masterclasses and introducing students to a lively mixture of song and opera repertoire. The students were encouraged to think about the differences

and similarities between opera and other types of singing and Anush, Katherine, Nick and Ella shared their stories of how they became professional musicians.

Our Futures visits ended at Wellfield Middle School in Whitley Bay, where we met their year six students who have been learning about opera through the Royal Opera House resources on Hansel and Gretel. The children were thrilled to meet and hear 'real live' opera singers in their school and demonstrated - with enormous enthusiasm - how well they could sing two songs from Humperdinck's opera.

In parallel with Samling Futures, we have launched our Singing Schools initiative, which gives in-depth coaching to choirs, soloists and - crucially - the staff, in schools (more about this on p2).

All of this work is provided at no cost to the schools and we are grateful for the support of the Three Monkies Trust and the Finn Family Fund for making this possible.

In March, the Samling Artist Programme for early career singers and pianists achieved another milestone as the number of Samling Artists passed four hundred. Our global reach increased

to 46 countries with our first Samling Artist from Greece and we welcomed two new leaders – soprano Marie McLaughlin and writer and director Susannah Waters to the team. Continuing our association with Berwickshire High School, a group of students attended an informal concert part way through the week and chatted to the artists and leaders over tea and cake afterwards.

We are now selecting the singers and pianists who will benefit from our Samling Artist Programme and Samling Academy over the next year. We have held Artist Programme auditions over three days in London and Glasgow and applications for Samling Academy are open now with auditions in mid-May.

Our current Academy are preparing for their summer production 'Lost and Found', directed by Samling Artists Miranda Wright and Leo Nicholson. Rehearsals for this semi-staged production begin in June, with a performance at The Glasshouse International Centre for Music on 12 July.

Miranda Wright became a Samling Artist in 1999. After performing professionally for several years, she discovered a passion for teaching. Since the creation of Samling Academy in 2012, she has been a valued member of the coaching team and has also directed Samling Academy Opera productions and summer concerts. Miranda joined the vocal staff at the Royal College of Music in 2023 and is Head of Classical Singing at Newcastle University. She will direct this year's Samling Academy semi-staged production 'Lost and Found'. My earliest musical memory is... dancing around in my nightie to a recording of Swan Lake, aged about three or four. Later these 'performances' became more organised and I cajoled our patient neighbours in to be the audience!

The last piece of music I listened to was... the Unst Boat Song performed by the Danish String Quartet. It's a real favourite in our house. Although Unst is in Shetland, this haunting melody always reminds me of time spent in the Hebrides with family.

In my spare time, I like to... walk in Weardale with my friend. We have been walking together weekly since lockdown and it's a wonderful time to de-stress and catch up on each other's lives.

### The musician I most admire is...

Dame Janet Baker. I have been listening to her my whole life.

My happy place is... The Ship Inn, Low Newton by the Sea. Happy times with friends and family eating crab sandwiches and walking along the Northumbrian coastline. The possession I would most hate to lose is... the upright piano that I learned to play on. I was brought up in a single parent family and when my Mum realised that I was musical (too much prancing around in my nightie!) she decided we needed a piano in the house. She found one in the back of a junk shop and thought it sounded nice and it was cheap. It turned out to be a Bechstein model from around 1900, complete with brass candlesticks! She obviously had a good ear!

#### The best thing I've ever found is...

#### My favourite Samling Academy memory is...

So many to choose from – that's very hard! I love the support that the young singers give each other in their masterclass groups. If someone has a breakthrough, either technical or interpretative, we all feel involved in that special moment. It's pure magic!

## Our first Singing School

Egglescliffe School has become the first Samling Singing School and the start of a new initiative for classical singing in the North East. Over the next three years we will embrace six state schools across the region, spreading Samling Institute's core principles of healthy and natural vocal production, commitment to text and learning through doing.

Over six weeks, sixty students in the school choir and soloists from years 9 and 10 received coaching from Samling Artist Miranda Wright. She also worked with the school music staff and provided guidance about suitable classical repertoire for developing voices.

This first phase of the programme ended with a performance for families and friends at which the singers demonstrated what they had learned.

'We chose Egglescliffe School because we knew we would get school-wide support for this investment which is essential and the progress the students made was palpable,' said Samling Institute's director Karon Wright.



Matthew Haworth, Subject Leader of Music at Egglescliffe said,

'I passionately believe that the best way to inspire our students is to expose them to excellence. Samling Institute is helping us to achieve this by bringing in truly world-class artists and coaches to inspire our students and staff and we are already seeing the amazing impact of this work. We are thrilled to be the first Samling Singing School!'

We will be continuing to support singing at Egglescliffe and we are now making plans to add two more schools to what will become a network of Singing Schools from the Rivers Tweed to the Tees. Egglescliffe students Tilly, Sophie, Amely, Ayah and Oliver who took part in solo workshops as part of Samling Singing Schools.
